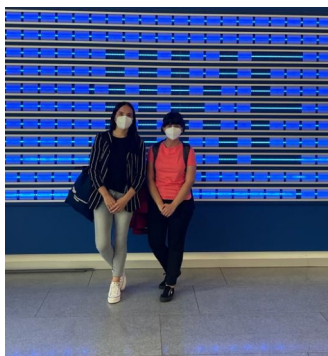

ISDM Conference 2022

Researchers from PCC-Net participated in the International Shared Decision Making Conference. During this event the core team presented preliminary findings of a scoping review that aimed at conceptualizing PCC in Latin America. Other members also had different talks, posters and workshops that involved PCC. Two of our members were elected as Board Members of the ISDM Society. We congratulate Dr Pola Hahlweg who has been appointed for a second period as Treasurer and Dr Paulina Bravo who was elected Secretary of the Society. Our special thank you to Prof Martin Härter who has ceased his position as President and will remain involved as Past President for the society.

Chilean researchers' visit to Germany



A few weeks ago, Paulina Bravo and Alejandra Martínez came all the way to meet fellow researchers and experts in Denmark and Germany. For instance, they visited the University Medical Center Schleswig-Holstein in Kiel to find out more about SHARE TO CARE - a large-scale program to implement shared decision making in all departments of the hospital, using strategies that target both the patients and the health professionals. Furthermore, they met with many colleagues at the University Medical Center Hamburg-Eppendorf (UKE), e.g. learning on how the Health Academy at the UKE promotes healthy lifestyles by enabling exchange between

Special issue on shared decision making published

In June 2022, a special issue in the context of the “International Shared Decision Making Conference 2022” has been published. Study protocol accepted on PCC in care for women with unintended pregnancy

The study protocol of the CarePreg study on the evaluation of person-centeredness in healthcare and social support services for women with unintended pregnancy (UP) was accepted. After qualitative pre-assessment of needs and experiences of women with UP and healthcare providers, the CarePreg study now evaluates person-centeredness in healthcare and social support services in Germany via a quantitative online survey. Aim is to deviate recommendations for improvement of care for women with UP in Germany.

Paper published on experienced patient-centeredness

In this study, items that measure experienced patient-centeredness were developed and selected to create a questionnaire (EPAT), which extends the assessment of patient-centeredness from the perspective of patients. You can find the publication here: <https://bit.ly/3QzEDnj>
