Constanza has joined the PCC NET core team recently. She will shortly introduce herself and her interest in patient-centered care so you get to know her a little bit.

My name is Constanza Quezada, and I am a Social Anthropologist from Santiago de Chile. I recently finished my master's degree in International Social and Public Policy at the London School of Economics and Political Science, with a focus on education, gender and civil participation. I am supporting research and coordination for the project, "Promoting Patient Participation in Care: Transferring Knowledge on patient-centered research, education, and clinical practice" (PRO-PACT).



In particular, I am interested in using social research findings to assist with the development of policies and improve the public understanding of social issues. Thus, I believe that patient-centered care should be at the core of the development and evaluation of health policies. From my perspective, shifting the focus from a 'passive' to an 'active' patient could have an enormous impact not only on patients' quality of life, but also on how the different actors involved in these processes relate to each other and challenge power structures and preconceived ideas. Patient-centered research is a vital topic to question and inform the healthcare model in which these policies are usually based on.


