Report on last PCC NET online seminar on shared decision-making

In the end of September, Dr. Natalie Joseph-Williams facilitated a PCC NET online seminar on *Achieving shared decision-making in routine practice: tools, challenges and solutions*. Dr. Joseph-Williams is a Senior Lecturer in Improving Patient Care at Cardiff University School of Medicine and Associate Director for the newly established Health and Care Research Wales



Evidence Centre and has over 16 years experience of researching, teaching, and implementing shared decision-making. She works together with policy makers, healthcare organizations, clinical teams and patients across the United Kingdom to implement shared decision-making in routine clinical care.

Her talk covered some tools which help to achieve shared decision-making in practice. Also, common challenges that usually arise dur-


ing the process and some solutions to these challenges were presented. Dr. Joseph-Williams also shared a patient's views and experiences. More than 250 people have participated in this online seminar. The majority of participants were clinicians from Chile.

Insights into the 22nd German Congress on Health Services Research

In October 2023, researchers, clinicians and experts met in Berlin, Germany, to exchange thoughts on the topic "Health services research - motor of evidence-based health policy". The program consisted of many interesting talks. One study which stayed in my (Nadine's) mind was N.E.S.T. This project provides families that have one or more children with disabilities,

with family-health-partners. Those family-health-partners help the family to find suitable health care structures, which are already available, but often difficult to find. The project evaluates whether family-health-partners have positive outcomes on the family's health care, quality of life and resilience (more info in German: https://forschungsprojekt-nest.de/).

de Chile in January 2023, were also presented at this conference. We received positive feedback on this project and people were very interested to hear about patient-centered care in Chile.

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Recent publication

Influencing factors on shared decision-making (SDM) implementation in cancer care In this a priori planned process evaluation of a SDM implementation trial at the University Medical Center Hamburg-Eppendorf (UKE), we aimed to identify influencing factors on implementation success based on the Consolidative Framework for Implementation Research (CFIR). We analyzed 107 interviews with healthcare professionals, 204 pages of field notes and 125 pages of meeting minutes via qualitative content analysis. We identified 28 major influencing factors covering all CFIR levels but mainly the level of the organization. Results of this study can be used to plan, conduct and analyze future implementation studies. (Please see https://bmchealthservres.biomedcentral.com/articles/10.1186/s12913-023-09778-w)
